WHAT'S IN THIS PACKET

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1. GENERAL OVERVIEW

WHO WE ARE:

Mission Adventures is a ministry of Youth With A Mission (YWAM) Global Gateway in Oliver. YWAM is an international, interdenominational missions organization. Our Mission Adventures program specializes in planning, organizing and hosting short-term outreaches for groups in the city of Oliver. Most of the groups that participate in our Mission Adventures program are youth, high school or College aged groups, however, we also host adult teams.

WHAT WE DO:

The focus of our Mission Adventures program is to give participants a taste of missions through education and experience:

Education:

We educate participants in many different areas: First Nations history and culture, Christian persecution, Hearing God's voice and Bible Meditation, Prayer and Intercession, Evangelism and how to work in teams.

Experience:

We want you to experience the full adventure of global missions. From sleeping on mats to eating different cultural food, we take you out of the comforts of North America. We provide various outreaches from working at Gleaners, a ministry that processes food to be shipped to other nations, to urban outreaches doing outdoor or indoor service projects for community members or working with the homeless. Within the program we incorporate Christian disciplines (bible meditation, prayer, etc.) and reflective activities (reflection stations, letters to self, etc.) to help participants engage with God. We also do team building/outdoor adventure activities as well as debrief times to unpack all of our activities.

THEOLOGY AND WORSHIP:

YWAM is an interdenominational organization. This means you may be interacting with other teams or people that may come from different theological backgrounds and worship styles. Therefore, we try to stick to basic theology and the basic Gospel. We ask that your team does the same. If other teams or people have different theologies or worship styles than your team is used to, we ask you to take a learning posture and discuss any conflicts with our staff. This is to protect all of our groups in our program, as well as our partners and other ministries. This is not intended to discourage your team from sharing the Gospel. We simply ask that you stick to the basic Gospel and avoid controversial theological subjects.

ROLE OF YOUR YWAM HOST:

The job of the YWAM host is to facilitate and guide your team's activities. Our hope is to take care of the majority of administrative details so you can enjoy the program elements and use this time to bond with your team. Your YWAM host will function as a guide and point person during your time with us. They will help answer any questions you have, making sure you get to where you need to be, taking care of and leading the program elements. Our desire is to give you the best missions exposure and experience we can.

"BOTH/AND" PROGRAM:

We realize short-term trips like this often benefit the participants more than those we reach out to. This is a "both/and" program. We want to see both our participants and those we reach out to be transformed by Jesus!

SAFETY:

The safety of all participants is ultimately the responsibility of the youth leader/team leaders and other chauffeurs on your team; however, our staff at YWAM Global Gateway will do everything in their power to ensure the safety of the participants and staff. Please see Safety on Page 18 for a list of Safety Guidelines.

AGE:

We suggest that youth who participate are at least 13 years of age. If you have younger students who want to participate, please contact us to discuss available options.

TEAM SIZE:

We are very flexible with the group size. Small or big we will make it work!

THE COST:

We charge a non-refundable group booking fee of \$75 dollars. In addition we charge \$75 per person per day. This covers all program related expenses including food, accommodations and all activities. The group booking fee is due upon the completion of your application and the per-person charge is due two weeks before the start of the program. The per person charge is fully refundable up until one week prior to the program. Should a team member be unable to attend at the last minute we can refund \$60 dollars per person/day within one week of your scheduled trip.

3.PROGRAM DETAILS AND OPTIONS

Indoor & Outdoor Outreaches: (Outreaches depend on season & need)

- Sunnybank Senior Care Home:
 - Here we visit the seniors one on one and/or in group settings. When in a group setting, we sing songs, play table games and visit in a common area. We have also done yard work for them in the past.
- Community Service:
 - Property cleanup
 - There are many seniors within Oliver who need help with yard work
 - Tidying the streets
 - Helping people move
 - Serving our First Nation (Syilx of the Okanagan Nation)
 - Serving the Homeless
 - Graffiti clean up
 - Gleaners:
 - Processing raw vegetables into a dry vegetable soup mix which is then made available to Christian organizations to help feed the hungry of the world.

Adventure/fun activities:

- A Taste of NIKO
 - A full NIKO program is 5 days but within Mission Adventures, we give the participants an afternoon that incorporates several elements of the original program
 - NIKO is a 5 day wilderness leadership training program where participants are in the outdoors developing their leadership, teamwork, surrender and servanthood values.
 - We partner with YWAM Mountain Refuge which is 15 minutes away from us as we run the program under them
- Hikes
- Floating the Penticton Canal (Outside of program time)
- Other Team building Activities & Team games
- Campfire (depending on season)

EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES & SPIRITUAL DISCIPLINES

- Learning about Human Trafficking and/or Christian persecution
- Classroom teaching on hearing God's voice
- Guided Bible Meditations/devotionals
- Evangelism (training and practice)
- Religion Tour (This is purely an educational experience,
 Religions we may learn about:
 - Syilx of the Okanagan Nation (First Nation)
 - Bhav Sagar Taran Sikh Temple
 - Kingdom Hall of Jehovah's Witnesses
 - Christ the King Catholic Church
- Creative prayer & blessing Activity

- Debriefs (After each activity we unpack and discuss our experience)

HOW TO MOVE FORWARD FROM HERE

If you want to participate in our Mission Adventures program, please contact us for availability. In order to secure your spot, we will need you to fill out our online Registration Form (accessible through our webpage) and pay a one-time Registration Fee of \$75. When we have received that we will email you to confirm the dates of your program with us.

We ask that you make travel plans to Oliver only after we have received your Registration Form and Fee and have sent you an email confirming the dates of your trip. If you need to make special arrangements regarding your arrival and departure times we require that you contact us BEFORE making travel plans.

Health and parental consent forms will be sent to you and will be due two weeks prior to your scheduled trip

4. THE LOGISTICS-WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

Arrival Time:

We are flexible on your time of arrival. This can be further discussed.

Departure Time:

Please plan to leave after breakfast and final clean up is completed. If you require an earlier departure time please contact us to make arrangements.

Accommodations:

Depending on the size and makeup of the team, you will either be hosted at our Global Gateway Ministry Center (for smaller teams) or at a local church. All participants can expect to sleep on the floor. Please plan to provide your own pillow, sleeping bag and sleeping mat unless communicated otherwise. We arrange to have guys and girls sleeping in separate areas but it is the job of the team leaders (ie. you and your youth leaders and chaperones) to make sure guys and girls are not in each other's areas.

Changes to Team Size:

For scheduling purposes, we ask that you talk to us as soon as possible with any changes as we may not be able to accommodate more participants than originally discussed.

Free Time:

There is not a lot of free time during your program. We may schedule some free time, but it is a few hours here and there. If you want to do some tourist activities in Oliver we suggest planning to do them either a day or two before or after your scheduled time with us.

Testimonies:

Participants may have opportunities to share their testimonies while they are here. We ask that you prepare your team members to share a 5-minute testimony, should the opportunity arise.

Insurance:

We ask that all participants obtain travel insurance while partnering with YWAM Global Gateway in our Mission Adventures program. Please make sure that each participant carries the necessary documentation in case a trip to the clinic is needed.

Safety:

As YWAM Global Gateway, we do everything in our power to ensure the safety of our participants and staff. However, it is important to note that you and your team leaders are ultimately responsible for the safety of your team. We will give you safety briefings before activities. For the safety of your participants we suggest that participants never go exploring alone and suggest staying in groups of three.

Crossing the Border:

If you are a team from the US, we will send you more information on crossing the border once your team is approved. If you have further questions about this please feel free to ask.

Transportation:

You will be responsible for all transportation for your team; vehicles and related costs. Our staff will be able to take care of their own transportation to and from activities

Food:

We will provide three meals each day as well as snacks for movie nights/campfires etc. Please let us know in advance if there are any food allergies or special diets we should be aware of. We will do our best to provide diet friendly options but we ask that individuals with dietary restrictions also be prepared to supplement their meals.

5. Parent/Guardian Letter

Dear Parents/Guardians,

We understand that it can be difficult to let your teenager leave home and go to the unknown. We want to start by thanking you for allowing your teenager to participate in this mission trip. It is important to us to make sure you are well informed about what your teenager will be doing while with us. The info outlined below is to help answer any questions you may have.

Youth With A Mission (YWAM) is an international, interdenominational, intergenerational missions organization. It was started in 1960 by a man, named Loren Cunningham, who had a dream of sending young people from every nation to every nation with the Gospel of Jesus. Our Mission Statement is: "To Know God and Make Him Known." Our hope is that during this trip your teen will get to know God more and make Him known to the people of Oliver. Beyond that, we also hope that your teenager will take home what they learned, that they will see God's heart for Oliver, and through that, also see God's heart for their own hometown.

Mission Adventures (MA) is a ministry of YWAM where teams come and partner with our full time staff for a missions trip. We provide food, housing, and arrange outreach opportunities. Information is given before any outreach activity, including safety guidelines. Our heart is our participants to get a taste of missions and for their lives to be touched by Christ.

Outreach Activities: Our outreach activities involve learning about issues such as Christian persecution, homelessness, First Nations Culture and reaching out to people of different faiths.

Safety: YWAM Global Gateway will do everything in our power to ensure the safety of our participants and staff. We do this through giving participants safety guidelines, educating participants on what to do in unsafe situations and suggesting that youth pastors and leaders do not allow their students to go anywhere in groups of less than three.
